Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2018.

2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved

- (1) The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement *Local Law No.4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2018* in order to protect the health and safety of persons using local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads and preserve features of the natural and built environment and other aspects of the amenity of local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads.
- (2) The purpose is to be achieved by providing for—
 - (a) the regulation of access to local government controlled areas; and
 - (b) the prohibition or restriction of particular activities in local government controlled areas or roads.

3 Authorising local law

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by *Local Law No.4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads)* 2018 (the *authorising local law*).

4 Definitions

- (1) Particular words used in this subordinate local law have the same meaning as provided for in the authorising local law.
- (2) The dictionary in schedule 7 defines particular words used in this subordinate local law.

Part 2 Use of local government controlled areas, facilities and roads

5 Prohibited and restricted activities—Authorising local law, section 5(1)

- (1) For section 5(1)(a) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 1 are declared to be prohibited in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 1.
- (2) For section 5(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 2 are declared to be restricted in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 2, to the extent described in column 3 of schedule 2.

6 Motor vehicle access in local government controlled areas—Authorising local law, section 6(1)(b)

For section 6(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the areas prescribed in column 1 of schedule 3 are declared to be motor vehicle access areas.

7 Prohibited vehicles—Authorising local law, section 6(3)

For section 6(3) of the authorising local law, the specific types of motor vehicle prescribed in column 2 of schedule 3 are declared to be prohibited vehicles in the corresponding specified motor vehicle access area in column 1 of schedule 3.

8 Opening hours for local government controlled areas—Authorising local law, section 7(1)

- (1) For section 7(1) of the authorising local law, the times prescribed in column 2 of schedule 4 are declared to be the opening hours for the local government controlled areas mentioned in column 1 of schedule 4.
- (2) However, the local government may, from time to time, by resolution, declare other times when a local government controlled area is open to the public.
- (3) Also, the opening hours for a local government controlled area do not include any period during which—
 - (a) the area is fenced so that the area is not open to the public; or
 - (b) the local government places, at each public entrance to the area, notice that the area is not open to the public.

9 Permanent closure of local government controlled area—Authorising local law, section 8(3)

For section 8(3) of the authorising local law, the local government controlled areas described in schedule 5 are permanently closed to public access.

Part 3 Matters affecting roads

10 Notice requiring owner of land adjoining road to fence land—Authorising local law, section 9(3)

For section 9(3) of the authorising local law, the minimum standards for a fence that is the subject of a compliance notice under section 9(2) of the authorising local law are as follows—

- (a) the fence must be constructed of materials which are of sufficient strength to—
 - (i) restrain the types of animals to be contained in the area adjacent to the fence; and
 - (ii) stop the animals from escaping over, under or through the fence; and

- (b) the height of the fence must be sufficient to restrain the types of animals to be contained in the area adjacent to the fence from jumping or climbing over the fence; and
- (c) if an animal to be contained in the area adjacent to the fence has the ability to dig the fence must include a barrier installed directly below the fence to prevent the animal digging its way underneath the fence; and
- (d) if the fence includes a gate the gate must be kept closed and latched except when in immediate use by a person entering or leaving the area adjacent to the fence.

Part 4 Miscellaneous

11 Repeal

This subordinate local law repeals Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2011.

busking means a musical performance undertaken by a person—

camp site means a part of a camping ground which is designated for occupation by a tent, inclusive of ropes, poles, supports and pegs incidental to the erection and use of the tent.

caravan park means a place for parking and residing in caravans, including a place that provides also for complementary accommodation.

caravan site, at a local government caravan park, means a part of the local government caravan park which is designated for a single accommodation of a particular type.

columbarium has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

complementary accommodation has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.8 (Operation of Caravan Parks) 2011.

crypt has the meaning given in *Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries)* 2011.

driver has the meaning given in the Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995.

emergency services officer means—

- (a) an officer of the Queensland Ambulance Service or an Ambulance Service of another State: or
- (b) an officer of the Queensland Fire and Rescue Service or a Fire and Rescue Service of another State; or
- (c) an officer or employee of another entity with the written permission of the Commissioner of the Police Service; or
- (d) an officer of the State Emergency Service or a State Emergency Service of another State; or
- (e) an officer or employee of an authority permitted by law to conduct utility installation or utility maintenance; or
- (f) an officer of Emergency Management Queensland.

entombment has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

footpath has the meaning given in the *Transport Operations* (Road Use Management) Act 1995.

goods includes wares, merchandise, chattels, money, stone, timber, metal, fluid and any other article, substance or material whatsoever.

grid means a structure designed to —

- (a) permit the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic along a road; but
- (b) prevent the passage of livestock.

guide dog has the meaning given in the Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dogs Act 2009.

handler has the meaning given in the Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dogs Act 2009.

hearing dog has the meaning given in the *Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dogs Act* 2009.

interfere means prevent from continuing or being carried out properly, get in the way of, or handle or adjust without permission, and *interference* has a corresponding meaning.

interment site has the meaning given in *Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9* (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

landing includes jetty, pontoon and wharf.

local government camping ground means a camping ground or fatigue management stop under the control of the local government, including a camping ground located on land owned by the local government or on land for which the local government is the trustee.

local government caravan park means a caravan park under the control of the local government, including a caravan park located on land owned by the local government or on land for which the local government is the trustee.

local government cemetery has the meaning given in *Local Law No. 1 (Administration)* 2011.

local government employee has the meaning given in the *Local Government Act* 2009.

local government office includes—

- (a) the public office of the local government; and
- (b) each place used by the local government for local government administration or management purposes and recorded in the asset register of the local government.

local government swimming pool means a swimming pool under the control of the local government, including a swimming pool located on land owned by the local government or on land for which the local government is the trustee and each swimming pool recorded in the asset register of the local government.

mall means a mall established by the local government under section 80A of the *Local Government Act 2009*.

mausoleum has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

memorial has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

modifying, a memorial to a deceased person in a local government cemetery, includes—

- (a) an addition, alteration, reconfiguration or physical change to a structural element of the memorial or an element of the memorial, for example, the perimeter fencing of the memorial, which changes the physical appearance of the memorial; and
- (b) painting, re-lettering, repairing (where glues or adhesives are required), sandblasting, cleaning with abrasives, straightening, underpinning and restoring the memorial; but
- (c) does not include general cleaning, for example, the removal of organic growth, the control of creepers, water based cleaning and the removal of graffiti.

monument has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

motor vehicle has the meaning given in the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995.*

 - (A) if the whole of the local government office is a non-public place—the local government office; or
 - (B) if a part of the local government office is a non-public place—the part of the local government office.

park means a public place which the local government has set apart for park, recreational or environmental purposes, and includes land designated as a park in the planning scheme of the local government.

plant has the meaning given in the *Biosecurity Act 2014*.

public office has the meaning given in the Local Government Act 2009.

public place —

- (a) has the meaning given in the *Local Government Act* 2009; but
- (b) does not include a non-public place.

reserve means land dedicated as a reserve, or granted in trust, under the *Land Act 1994* and for which the local government is a trustee under that Act and other land held in trust by the local government which the local government has set apart for recreational or environmental purposes, and includes land designated as a reserve in the planning scheme of the local government.

responsible person, for a gate or grid installed across a road, means—

- (a) the person who installed the gate or grid, or the gate and the grid; and
- (b) the person for whose use or benefit the gate or grid, or the gate and the grid, were installed; and
- (c) the person who has the benefit of the gate or grid, or the gate and the grid installed across the road.

road—

(a) has the meaning given in the authorising local law; and

- (b) includes—
 - (i) an area of land that—
 - (A) is developed for, or has as 1 of its main uses, the driving or riding of motor vehicles; and
 - (B) is open to, or used by, the public; and
 - (ii) a footpath or bicycle path.

rose garden has the meaning given in Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries) 2011.

sewerage system has the meaning given in the *Plumbing and Drainage Act 2002*.

ship has the meaning given in the Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act 1994.

stormwater drain has the meaning given in the Local Government Act 2009.

structure has the meaning given in the Local Government Act 2009.

swimming pool has the meaning given in the Building Act 1975.

swimming pool complex means that part of a local government controlled area that comprises a local government swimming pool, the pool deck area surrounding the pool and any facilities at the pool such as amenities, food service areas, reception, gymnasium, bathing and seating areas.

unregistered, for a vehicle that is required to be registered under the *Transport Operations* (*Road Use Management – Vehicle Registration*) *Regulation 2010*, means that the vehicle is not a registered vehicle.

utility installation means—

- (a) the supply of water, hydraulic power, electricity or gas; or
- (b) the provision of sewerage or drainage services; or
- (c) the provision of telecommunications services.

utility maintenance means the maintenance of—

- (a) water, hydraulic power, electricity or gas services; or
- (b) sewerage or drainage services; or
- (c) telecommunications services.

vault has the meaning given in *Subordinate Local Law No. 1.9 (Operation of Cemeteries)* 2011.

vegetation means trees, shrubs, plants and all other organisms of vegetable origin (whether living or dead).

vehicle has the meaning given in the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act* 1995.

waste has the meaning given in the Environmental Protection Act 1994.

water supply system has the meaning given in the Standard Plumbing and Drainage Regulation 2003.
