Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as Subordinate Local Law No.2 (Animal Management) 2019.

2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved

- (1) The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2019, which provides for regulation of the keeping of and control of animals within the local government area.
- (2) The purpose is to be achieved by providing for schedules referred to in the local law of:
 - (a) the circumstances in which the keeping of animals is prohibited;
 - (b) the circumstances in which keeping of animals requires a permit;
 - (c) the circumstances in which desexing of an animal is required;
 - (d) specific standards for keeping animals of a particular species or breed;
 - (e) breeding of animals that does not require a permit;
 - (f) the exclusion of animals, or animals of a specified species, from public places;
 - (g) designated dog off-leash areas;
 - (h) other local governments or organisations able to accept impounded animals;
 - (i) the conditions to be complied with by persons who offer animals, or a particular species of animal, for sale; and
 - (j) the designation of wildlife habitat areas.

3 Authorising local law

- (1) The making of the schedules in this subordinate local law is authorised by Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2019 (the authorising local law).
- (2) At the head of each Schedule there is a reference to the relevant authorizing Local Law section.

Part 2 Repeals

4 Repeal

This local law repeals -

(a) Subordinate Local Law No.2 (Animal Management) 2011.

Note: The application of Schedule 1 (Prohibition on Keeping of Animals) does not apply to premises where a Development Permit pertains to the use of land for animal husbandry.

	2 A permit is required to keep more than 3 dogs over the age of 12 weeks on a premises 8,000m2 or greater.		
Poultry	A permit is required to keep more than 10 poultry on a premises in an urban area.		
Rooster	A permit is required to keep a rooster in an urban area.		
Stock	A permit is required to keep stock in an urban area.
